N represents sample size, r represents the test statistic, df represents the degrees of freedom, and the p-value represents significance with an alpha level of 0.05.

Adult obesity rate vs. national diabetes rate	51	-0.011	49	0.944

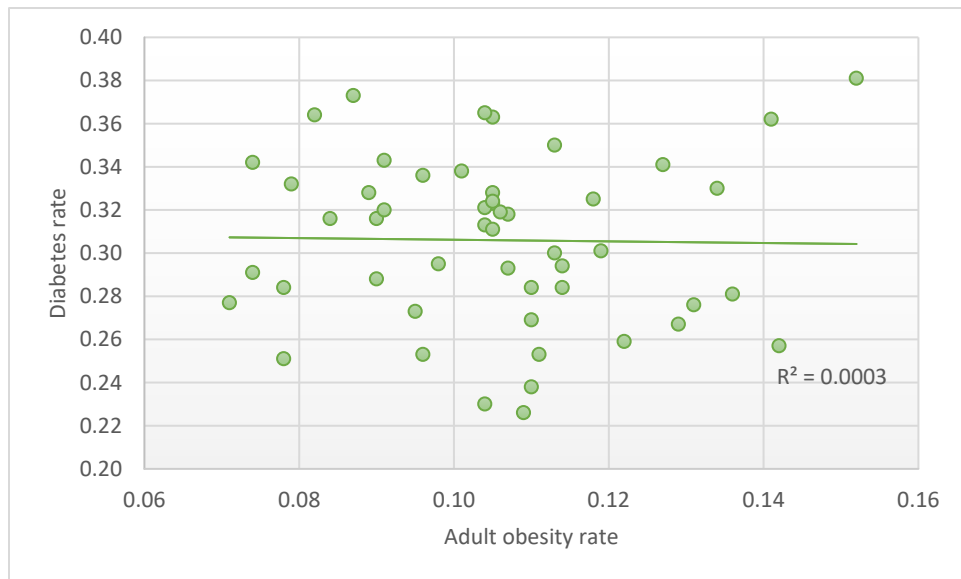


Figure 1: Scatterplot representation of adult obesity rate compared to the national diabetes rate. The r^2 value generated indicates low confidence in a linear relationship between adult obesity rate and diabetes rate.

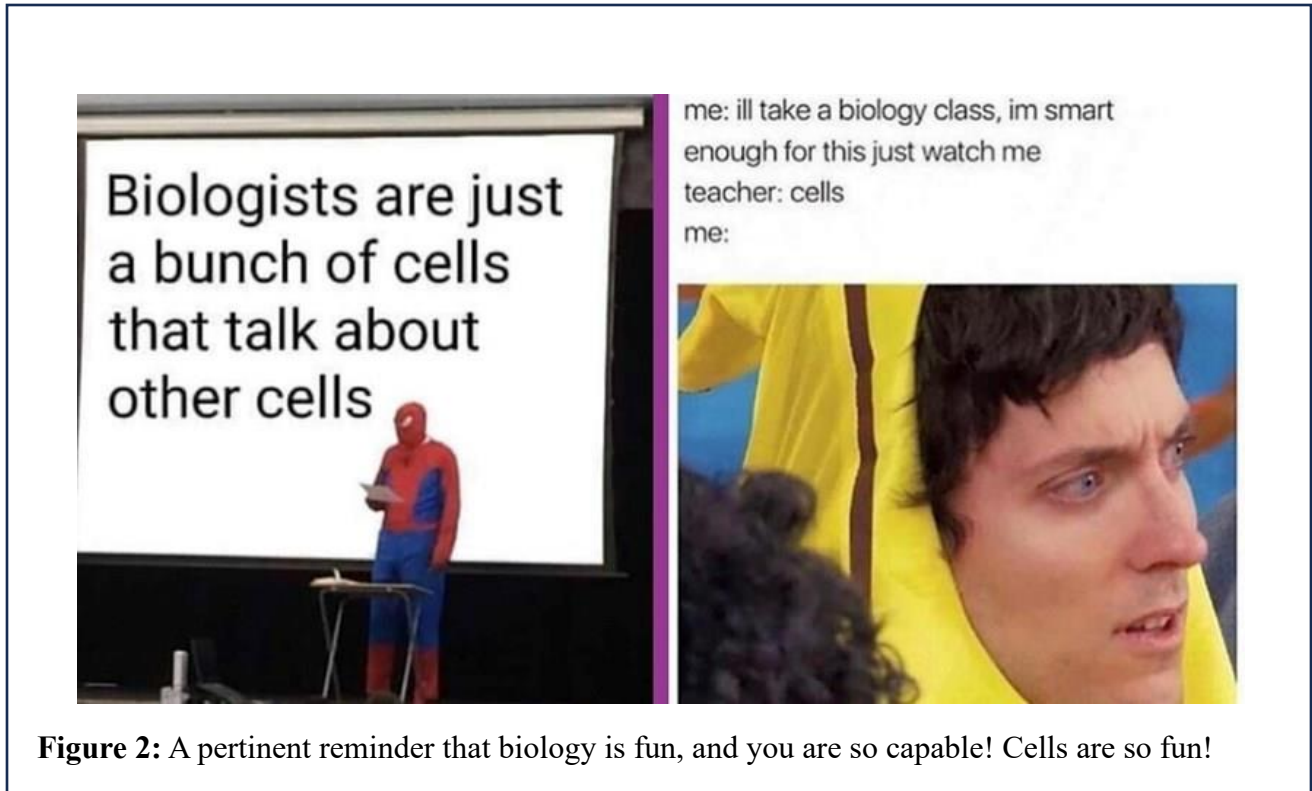


Figure 2: A pertinent reminder that biology is fun, and you are so capable! Cells are so fun!
